

## **TCP Instructor Requirements**



The ability to instruct the Traffic Control Person course requires traffic control experience, knowledge of the course content, reliable access to the internet, and experience in adult education. In particular ideal Instructors should have the following:

- 2000 hours traffic control experience in the last 5 years preferably in a variety of situations and environments (eg rural and urban environments, winter/summer conditions) and using various forms of traffic control equipment.
- proven experience in a TCP Supervisory role.
- possess a current and valid BCCSA TCP Record of Completion.
- possess a current and valid BC drivers licence.
- possess a minimum current Level 1 Occupational First Aid.
- be in good physical health including good hearing and good vision.
- knowledge and familiarity with the BCCSATCP Participant Guide and all relevant materials, regulations and standards related to traffic control, such as the BC Traffic Management Manual (TMM), BC Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure updates and technical circulars, the Workers' Compensation Act, WorkSafeBC Occupational Health and Safety Regulation (OHSR), and the BC Motor Vehicle Act.
- experience with adult education and/or coaching to a wide range of students.
- strong oral and written communication skills.
- strong administration skills providing BCCSA with timely and accurate information .
- experience with instructional media such as laptops, computers, projectors, reliable internet access. and a valid email account.
- strong skills with computers and Microsoft Office (WORD, Outlook, Excel, Powerpoint) and the ability to use video conferencing.
- a willingness to independently upgrade presentation and instructional skills by accessing on-line or vocational workshops.
- must be willing to travel outside of home region.
- must be willing to teach a minimum of 6 public courses annually.

The quality of the Instructor as a representative of the BCCSA is critical as is the Instructor's on-going competency and conduct.
