

## Fire Department Contacts – Technical High Angle Rope Rescue

British Columbia's Occupational Health & Safety Regulation requires employers to establish and maintain the means necessary to safely and efficiently rescue workers who may become injured or otherwise stranded at elevations during the performance of their work.

To meet this highly technical rescue requirement, employers in specified WorkSafeBC Assessment Classification Units (CUs) whose workers have a high probability of requiring high angle rescue, may contact the local fire department to arrange for rescue service. To determine whether you are in a funding CU and may qualify for this service, please review the [THARR Program Operating Guidelines](#).

THARR Program funding does not obligate a fire department to provide rescue in unsafe situations. Firefighters have a right to refuse unsafe work.

Once eligibility is established, contact the local fire department at the number below and ask to speak with the person who has responsibility for managing the THARR program.
